Abstract:

Both the methodology and the theories of business ethics have always been influenced by economics and related empirical disciplines. During the last decades, there have been two major developments in this regard that have brought experimental research to the forefront: Both experimental economics and experimental philosophy are two significant theoretical and empirical enterprises that cannot be neglected. If business ethics aims to take empirical research seriously, it should also take these developments systemically into account. I will explore some of the chances and opportunities that an "experimental ethics" holds, as well as connecting it to the theoretical foundations of business ethics. Moreover, I will present some results of experimental studies undertaken in my Experimental Ethics Lab (EEL) in Munich.
